Poetry is beautiful owing to numerous trees which naturally landscape our area. Sadly, due to the excessive heat and limited rains, many trees, even large trees are at risk of peril. As seen above, tree leaves turning brown and dry are a sign of inadequate water. Arborist, Dr. Randall Stanley, says that when watering trees, a good rule is to water $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch each week. The way to do this is to put a can out and turn sprinkler off when it fills to the $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch level so as to not overwater.

Synopsis of August 10th Regular Meeting:

Reports:

Financial: Mayor Senkevech read July end and the updated Q3 Budget vs. Actual report as well as the Sales & Use Tax receipts report.

Secretary: Volunteer Evie Anderson read this report.

- Town Hall report: Cm Anderson reported on progress on the Town Hall site.
- Approved Minutes from the July 18th meeting.
- Approved paying legal bill of \$1218.75.
- <u>Approved</u> paying Hunt County final Election bill of \$2667.50 and a voting equipment fee of \$500.
- <u>Discussed</u> possible Zoning ordinance for Poetry with legal council present.
- <u>Discussed</u> legal requirement to have a 1445
 agreement allowing the county to handle items
 in the ETJ (as prior to incorporation) approved
 but pending the addition of voluntary
 annexation update to the town map.
- <u>Discussed</u> the Zero Zoning Ordinance presented by <u>Councilmember White</u>.
 The Council decided to bring it back next meeting with the attorney present.
- <u>Discussed</u> the "1445 agreement" which would allow Kaufman County to approve all building requirements in the ETJ of the Poetry area. The council decided to bring it back with amendments and the attorney present for the next meeting to discuss further.
- <u>Learned</u> with attorney present that 100% of those on private roads must agree to give the town jurisdiction before a private road can be approved to become a town road.
- <u>Postponed</u> acting on possible changes to Poetry Post owing to lateness of meeting.
- <u>Voted</u> to purchase two phones and business plan with Spectrum and internet phone service.
- The meeting adjourned at 10:36 pm.

UPCOMING EVENTS:


CHANGE: The council voted to move the Regular meetings to the 3rd Thursday of each month.
