

1. Why do you wish to serve in the government of Poetry?

Most importantly, because I believe God has called me to do so. I originally thought I'd just serve my neighbors for the first term of office, but I feel led to continue to volunteer my efforts if it's wanted. - **Improving our roads:** While we have made progress in repairing our roads, there is still much work to be done. We need to work with our neighboring counties to secure cost-effective road agreements, increase funding for road maintenance, and establish a proactive system for identifying and addressing road issues before they become major problems.

3. When you were first considering the possibility of Poetry incorporating, what did you see as the biggest positive from incorporation, and what was your biggest concern?

When Poetry was considering incorporation, my biggest concern was the potential for increased government intervention, regulations, and taxes. I firmly believe that small government is best, and I was committed to preventing any unnecessary burdens on our community. However, I saw the biggest positive as the potential for greater control over our town's future and decision-making processes. By incorporating, we were able to ensure that our community's needs and interests were represented and protected while they would have been under direct threat if Terrell had continued to expand our way. I am proud to have played a role in preventing the county from expanding throughfare roads in our town, and I remain committed to safeguarding the unique character and values of Poetry.

4. What makes you stand out from other candidates?

As an Eagle Scout, small business owner, and 15-year resident of Poetry, I bring a unique blend of experiences and skills to the table. I am deeply committed to preserving our town's rural character and protecting the interests of our community.
